2. DISCUSSION

a. Facility Committee Meeting Report - Mr. James

The Facilities Committee met earlier today with the purpose of discussing the status of the new Horry County Education Center and projected modular classroom needs. Mr. James and members of the Committee asked the architect to include the addition of a kitchen to the current plans and work to reduce overall cost. The Facilities Department will present this information to the Board at the February 3, 2020, Board Work Session. Mr. Burch presented a slideshow with information regarding projected growth in each attendance area with the biggest growth projected in the Carolina Forest area. A request was made to provide the Board with a total cost including both the modular units and the site work.

b. Monitoring Report: R-3 Science - Ms. Myrick

Monitoring Report R-3 was presented.

c. Monitoring Report: OE-13 Facilities Quarterly Report - Mr. Wolfe

Monitoring Report OE-13 was presented. Mr. Wolfe noted the Aynor Elementary loop was near completion. Mr. Wolfe also noted the Pee Dee Elementary loop was redesigned moving the loop to the opposite side of the property due to a conflict with utilities.

d. Monitoring Report: OE-6 Quarterly Financial Statement - Mr. Gardner

Monitoring Report: OE-6 was presented. Mr. Gardner stated that the district is in good financial position. He also shared specifically the availability of residual funds in the school building program.

e. Update on Comprehensive Employee Compensation Study - Ms. Anderson

Ms. Anderson gave an update on the Employee Compensation Study that is presently under way. Ms. Anderson stated the management company is currently in the data collection portion of the study. One of the goals is to ensure the grade structure is correct for employees. Ms. Anderson stated the report was due to be finalized on April 30, 2020. Ms. Anderson stated she would share information with the Board as it becomes available.

f. Superintendent's Report

1. 2020 United States Census

Dr. Maxey expressed the importance of the 2020 Census and how the collected data impact our daily lives. Dr. Maxey noted the data are used to determine states' political representation in Congress as well as funding for services and infrastructure in our community such as health care, senior centers, jobs, roads, schools, and businesses.

Mr. Burch mentioned that methods for participating in the 2020 Census include online, mail, or phone options. HCS is using several social media platforms, public service announcements, and speakers at cluster meetings to reach out to communities to increase awareness of residents' participation in the 2020 Census.

2. January - School Board Appreciation Month

Dr. Maxey recognized the Board Members for their service and expressed his appreciation for all they do for our students and employees. Several schools sent tokens of appreciation that were presented to the Board prior to the meeting.

e. 2019 State Championship, We The People: The Citizen and the Constitution - Academy for the Arts, Science & Technology

The *We the People* Competition Team from the Academy for the Arts, Science & Technology (AAST) won the *We the People: The Citizen and the Constitution* state championship and will compete for the national title on April 24-27 in Washington, D.C.

We the People is one of many instructional programs and competitive events sponsored by the South Carolina Bar's Law-Related Education Division. The program enhances students' understanding of the institutions of American constitutional democracy, while also discovering the contemporary relevance of the Constitution and Bill of Rights. The culminating activity is a simulated congressional hearing in which students "testify" before a panel of judges.

Students demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of constitutional principles and have opportunities to evaluate, take, and defend positions on relevant historical and contemporary issues.
