


Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) Results

In South Carolina, all students in their third year of high school have the opportunity to take one of these two assessments at no cost, based on their individual preferences and post-graduation plans. On this assessment, students earn scores in Evidence-Based Reading and Writing (EBRW) and Mathematics, as well as a composite score. The charts below summarize the average performance of the senior class of 2024 for the district, state, and nation. Results are reported for the senior class since many students benefit from super scoring on their SAT assessments.


2022-2024 HCS Results




SAT Test Takers




The American College Testing (ACT) Results


HCS ACT - Longitudinal




ACT Test Takers


SAT & ACT Senior Test-Takers (Longitudinal Comparison)



Advance Placement (AP) Assessment Results

Advanced Placement (AP) courses are a set of rigorous courses that offer students the opportunity to earn college credit based on their performance on the AP exam associated with each course. To earn college credit at participating universities, students must achieve a minimum score of three out of five on the exam administered at the end of their enrollment in the course. The charts below summarize the number of AP exams administered and the percentage of students earning a score of three or higher in Horry County Schools for the 2023-2024 school year. In order to earn an AP Capstone Diploma, students must achieve scores of 3 or higher in AP Seminar and AP Research, as well as on four additional AP Exams of their choosing.


Number of AP Exams Administered

International Baccalaureate (IB) Assessment Results

The International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO) is a nonprofit educational foundation based in Geneva, Switzerland. IBO's Diploma Program is a high school program offered to students in the final two years of school. Horry County Schools offers an IB program at two high schools: Aynor High School and Socastee High School. Each test in the subject groups is graded on a scale of 1 to 7. The reported table displays results for students taking IB subject area tests and receiving a score of 4 or higher (4 = satisfactory performance; 5 = good; 6 = very good; 7 = excellent). In order to earn an IB Diploma, a student must complete six IB courses, including three at Higher Level (HL) and three at Standard Level (SL), and earn at least 24 points on IB exams. Students must also complete the Theory of Knowledge course and the Extended Essay.

South Carolina Career Readiness Assessment Results


The South Carolina Career Ready Test is a career readiness assessment administered to all eleventh-grade students to measure the most common skills that employers define as foundational for career readiness. For the 2023-2024 school year, South Carolina used the WIN career readiness assessment for this purpose. Based on their performance on this assessment, students may earn one of the following WIN career-ready credentials, which can be used for employment: bronze, silver, gold, or platinum. To be qualified as career-ready on this assessment, students must earn a minimum of a Silver certificate.


HCS SC Career Readiness Test - Longitudinal

Additional College and Career Ready Indicators

In addition to the previously reported measures, South Carolina students are deemed college-ready if they earn six hours of state-identified dual-enrollment courses with a grade of C or higher.

Furthermore, South Carolina students are deemed career-ready if they complete a Career and Technology Education (CTE) major program with a work-based credential, complete a work-based learning internship, earn a qualifying score on the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) test, or complete a South Carolina High School Employment Credential program.




College and Career Readiness (CCR)

In the state of South Carolina, graduates are deemed college or career-ready if they have accomplished one of the following:

- Earn a qualifying score on the SAT, ACT, ASVAB, or WIN tests,
- Earn a C or higher in six dual enrollment credit hours,
- Complete a work-based learning internship,
- Attain CTE completer status and earn an industry credential,
- · Pass an AP or IB exam, or
- Earn an employability credential.

All students from the fourth-year cohort for each high school are included in this metric, even those who did not earn a diploma. The following charts outline the performance of students in HCS and the state for the past three years. In 2023-2024, Horry County Schools posted its highest college and career readiness rate since the metric began appearing on South Carolina school report cards in 2020.

On-Time Graduation Rate Results

The four-year on-time graduation rate is based on the percentage of students who successfully earn a standard high school diploma within four years of entering high school. A student who enters one of our high schools at any time during the four years is included in this metric. In 2023-2024, Horry County Schools posted its highest on-time graduation rate since the metric began appearing on South Carolina school report cards in 2008.
