Interpretation: I interpret this policy to mean...each Spring, each school in the district will administer the State-developed anonymous survey to all teachers, the students in the highest grade in the building, and a random sample of the parents. The district staff and school staffs will analyze the results and take appropriate action to strengthen the positive perception of the stakeholders as represented in the survey results.

Evidence of Status of Compliance:

In the spring of 2019, all schools administered the State-developed surveys to teachers, students and parents. A total of 2,936 teachers responded to the anonymous online survey. A total of 9,114 students in grades 5, 8 and 11 (per State guidelines) responded to an anonymous online survey and a total of 4,460 parents responded to an anonymous paper/pencil survey. While the survey

asked for opinions in a variety of areas, three broad areas are reported on the annual State Report Card to measure satisfaction levels with their school's learning environment, social and physical environment, and home-school relations. Survey results are shared with district staff and all principals with schools addressing ways to improve in their weakest areas. The percentages of 2019 respondents are shown below for those who either "strongly agreed" or "agreed" with the statement on those three broadly stated items:

Satisfaction with the school's learning environment:

- Teachers 91.7%
 Students 83.3% (ES & MS) 75.7% (HS)

Satisfaction with the school's social and physical environment:

- Teachers 92.4%
 Students 85.3% (ES & MS) 80.9% (HS)
- Parents 86.7%

Satisfaction with the school's home-school relations:

- Teachers 87.3%
 Students 85.7% (ES & MS) 82.5% (HS)
- Parents
 73.3%
