

• Parent-Student Guides were printed for the 2019-20 school year that outlined expected student conduct and sanctions applied in case of disorderly conduct. Parents were given a copy, and the guide is posted on the District's website. Each student receives a copy of the policy included in the school's handbook.



- Appeal Board training and reviews were held as necessary for District Appeal Board members to review procedures, District policies, and law.


