**Interpretation:** *I interpret this policy to mean...each Spring, each school in the district will administer the State-developed anonymous survey to all teachers, the students in the highest grade in the building, and a random sample of the school's parents. The district staff and schools' staffs will analyze the results and take appropriate action to strengthen the positive perception of the stakeholders as represented in the survey results.*

**Evidence of Status of Compliance:**

Due to unprecedented conditions that resulted in the closure of schools in South Carolina effective March 13, 2020, the state suspended the administration of state accountability assessments for reporting purposes. In addition, the state did not provide the state-developed Parent, Student, or Teacher Opinion Surveys for 2020 that districts are required to administer in the spring of each school year. Horry County Schools was notified on March 26, 2020, that the surveys had been canceled for the 2019-20 school year. Therefore, the district does not have a measure of the perceptions of stakeholders for the 2019-20 school year.
