NEW SOCASTEE AREA MIDDLE SCHOOL ATTENDANCE ZONE PROPOSAL

General Information

The proposed attendance area for the New Socastee Area Middle School would include the Lakewood Elementary (LKE) attendance area. This proposal incorporates the proposed moves from LKE to Socastee Elementary (SE) as shown in a separate proposal. In other words, the New Socastee Area Middle School would include the LKE attendance area after the proposed moves between LKE and SE. For details on the proposed changes between LKE and SE please see those maps and information items.

- All statistics presented cannot account for the impacts of student transfer activity to and from the respective schools. Transfers can, and will, affect these calculations.
- The membership forecasts try to take into account where the various growth areas are currently occurring. However changes in where student in migration occurs can and will affect these estimates.
