
Evidence of Status of Compliance:

We are in full compliance of this policy. Evidence is listed below:


- Parent-Student Handbooks were printed for the 2014-15 school year that outlined expected student conduct and sanctions applied in case of disorderly conduct. Parents were given a copy and the handbook is posted on the district's website. Each student receives a copy of the policy included in the school's handbook.
- Student hearings are conducted by District Hearing Officers for students who have violated established codes of conduct and appropriate punishments are assigned. (See attachments for HCS's hearings, expulsions, and appeals to the District and to the School Board)

- Unruly student behavior that disrupts the learning environment is dealt with. (See attachments for high school, middle school, and elementary school data comparisons)
- Quarterly meetings and trainings are held with school district administrators to discuss discipline issues, concerns, and procedures.
- Appeal Board training and reviews are held as necessary for District Appeal Board members to review procedures, district policies, and laws.

Discipline Incident Totals Three Year Comparisons




Discipline Incident Counts Elementary Schools Three Year Comparison




Discipline Incident Counts Elementary Schools Three Year Comparisons




Discipline Incident Counts Elementary Schools Three Year Comparison




Discipline Incident Counts Middle Schools Three Year Comparison




Discipline Incident Counts High Schools Three Year Comparison



Discipline Incident Counts Program Schools Three Year Comparison




Expulsion Hearings Three Year Comparison


