

Quarterly Executive Summary Update Reflects Previous Quarter's Activity Canopy Projects Q1 2015



- **Project Scope:** The project is to add and expand exterior walkway canopies at bus and car drop-off loops at various facilities in the Horry County School District. The project will consist of a total of five groups (approximately 16,000 linear feet) to receive a new canopy or canopy extension and are broken down by location; **Group I** AES, AHS, AMS, DES, GSFE, GSFH, LH, LM, ME, **Group 2** AAST, BWM, CFE, CFH, HCEC, PBE, OBE, OBM, WES, **Group 3** ATA, CES, CHS, HWE, KES, PDE, SCES, TLC, WPM, **Group 4** MBE, MBH, MBI, MBM, MBP, NMBE, NMBH, NMBI, NMBM, NMBP, **Group 5** BES, FBE, FBM, LKE, SES, SHS, SJE, SJH, SJM, SSE
- Group 1, 2, and 3 canopies have been installed and work is complete. Current Status: Construction on Group 4 will be complete by Friday, April 10<sup>th</sup>, with the installation of safety bollards at Ocean Drive Elementary School. Construction for the canopies at Conway Middle which was originally in Group 2, but was delayed due to the site work project occurring during their original scheduled date, is expected to begin the week of April 20<sup>th</sup>. Weather permitting; it should take 3 weeks to complete the Conway Middle Canopies. Materials have been ordered for all canopies in Group 5 and construction is expected to start the second week of May and continue through September. Canopies for NMB Middle, Seaside Elementary School and St. James High School were delayed due to planned site work and renovations that were not yet determined when their groups were in progress. Canopies for these schools will be designed and engineered during May and June of this year 2015. Materials will be ordered and canopies for these schools will be constructed in the fall/ winter of 2015 upon completion of Group 5.

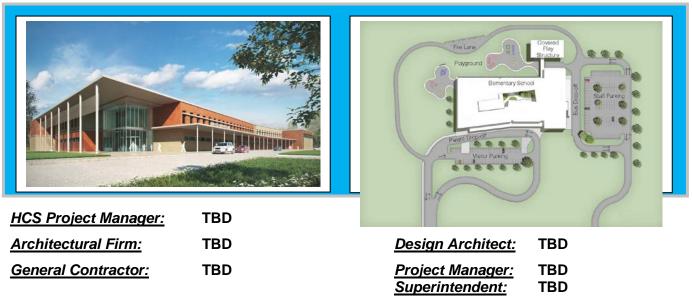

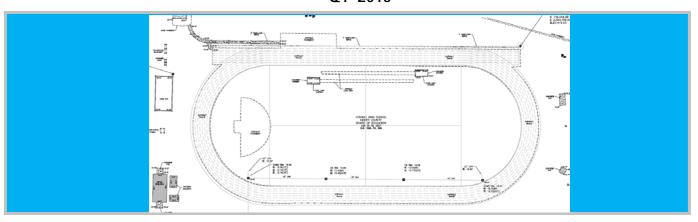

Project Scope:

A significant renovation will be undertaken that will include all areas exclusive of the most recently constructed classroom wing and gymnasium section (2007) and the kitchen and related back of house spaces. The scope of work includes new carpet / tile in all the classrooms, new paint and casework, new doors and hardware, along with minor renovations to all the student toilets in each of the classrooms. The Administration area will include a light renovation to move the nurse's clinic to the administration area and bring the Art and Music classrooms and other uses currently in the portables back into the main building. The Learning Commons will receive a significant refreshing as well as both exterior playgrounds. A new security vestibule will be added as well. Schematic Designs were completed in March 2015 and current plans are expected to be complete in order to advertise by late April and take bids late May. A new leased modular classroom building will be used for the CD grade until the new school construction projects are completed, at such time returning MBP to a PK-1 facility with no portable classrooms.
