We are in full compliance of this policy. Evidence is listed below:

Property and casualty insurance coverage is maintained on district property
with limits equal to 80% of replacement value. All properties in the school
district are insured for at least 80% of replacement value. Insurance coverage
is updated annually by the district in compliance with the replacement value
schedule provided by the State Insurance Reserve Fund. A replacement value

on-site assessment is conducted by the State Insurance Reserve Fund every 7 -10 years.

- The District has Comprehensive General Liability Insurance coverage protecting board members, staff and the district itself in an amount that is reasonable for school districts of comparable size and character.
- All school district personnel and Board members are bonded up to \$50,000. Additionally, the Chief Financial Officer is bonded for \$1 million.
- To protect intellectual property, information, files, records and fixed assets, the district has established a records storage facility at the Horry County Schools' Records Center.
- All available cash resources of the District are invested by the Horry County
 Treasurer in compliance with state law. The County Treasurer maintains an
 aggressive cash management program which consists of expediting the
 receipt of revenues and prudently investing available cash in obligations
 collateralized by instruments issued or guaranteed by the United States
 Government or the State of South Carolina.
- The Facilities Department developed a short and long term facilities plan in 2012. The Board of Education has established priorities for new facilities, additions, renovations, and sustainment projects.
