Reading Intervention Programs

The following programs are part of the District's "Tier 3" interventions, the most "intensive" remediation in reading.

Intervention Program	Description
Kaleidoscope	Stand- alone intervention program designed to accelerate reading instruction for students reading two or more years below grade level. This program provides daily research based instruction in decoding, fluency, comprehension, dictation and spelling, grammar and mechanics, and writing. Placement assessments and progress monitoring assessments are provided to identify students' greatest areas of concern and weakness in terms of literacy development. This is an ELA core replacement program for grades 2-4.
Language!	Comprehensive literacy program designed to increase the performance of students who are reading two or more years below grade level. The goal of the program is to accelerate learning, so students can access grade-level content. Daily, <i>Language!</i> integrates the five essential components of reading through a systematic six-step instructional format. Placement assessments and progress monitoring assessments are provided to help teachers meet the instructional needs of all students. This is an ELA core replacement program for grades 4-8.
Read180 (A separate comprehensive analysis on Read180 is forthcoming.)	Core instruction model combining research-based practices with the effective use of technology, offering students an opportunity to achieve reading success through a combination of teacher-directed, computer-individualized, and independent reading components. This is an ELA core replacement program available to students in grades 6 to 12.





- For two years, performance Language! students without an IEP has been better than the performance of all students as a whole in grades 4-5.






Average Lexile Growth measured by Language!: School years '11-12 and '12-13

- For two years, middle school Language! students without an IEP have exceeded the expected growth.






MIDDLE SCHOOL: LANGUAGE!




