

# SC K-12 Schools & Libraries Network CIPA Compliance Certification

I hereby certify my school/district/system acknowledges that it must be 100% compliant with the "Protecting Children in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Act" by July 1, 2012 as required by the FCC E-Rate Program rules. ## 1) Technology Protection Measures

A technology protection measure is a specific technology that blocks or filters \*Internet access. It must protect against access by adults and minors to visual depictions that are obscene, child pornography, or — with respect to use of computers with Internet access by minors — harmful to minors. It may be disabled for adults engaged in bona fide research or other lawful purposes. For schools, the policy must also include monitoring the online activities of minors.

## 2) Internet Safety Policy


The Internet safety policy must address the following issues:

- Access by minors to inappropriate matter on the Internet and World Wide Web
- The safety and security of minors when using electronic mail, chat rooms, and other forms of direct electronic communications
- Unauthorized access including "hacking" and other unlawful activities by minors online
- Unauthorized disclosure, use, and dissemination of personal information regarding minors
- Measures designed to restrict minors' access to materials harmful to minors
- For Schools, provide for the education of minors about appropriate online behavior, including interacting with other individuals on social networking sites and in chat rooms, and cyber bullying awareness and response.

## 3) Public Notice and Hearing or Meeting

The authority with responsibility for administration of the school or library must provide reasonable public notice and hold at least one public hearing or meeting to address a proposed technology protection measure and Internet safety policy.
