The district will allocate the necessary resources to strengthen the perception of the stakeholders.	Yes			

<u>Interpretation:</u> I interpret this policy to mean...each Spring, each school in the district will administer the State-developed anonymous survey to all teachers, the students in the highest grade in the building, and a random sample of the school's parents. The district staff and schools' staffs will analyze the results and take appropriate action to strengthen the positive perception of the stakeholders as represented in the survey results.

Evidence of Status of Compliance:

In the spring of 2018, all schools administered the State-developed surveys to teachers, students and parents. A total of 2,858 teachers responded to the anonymous online survey. A total of 9,429 students in grades 5, 8 and 11 (per State guidelines) responded to an anonymous online survey and a total of 4,199

parents responded to an anonymous paper/pencil survey. While the survey asked for opinions in a variety of areas, three broad areas are reported on the annual State Report Card – measuring satisfaction levels with their school's learning environment, social and physical environment, and home-school relations. The survey results are shared with the district staff and all principals, with each school addressing ways to improve in their weakest areas. The percentages of 2018 respondents is shown below for those who either "strongly agreed" or "agreed" with the statement on those three broadly stated items:

Satisfaction with their school's learning environment:

•	Teachers	90.6%
•	Students	80.0%
•	Parents	88.8%

Satisfaction with their school's social and physical environment:

•	Teachers	91.2%
•	Students	82.0%
•	Parents	85.4%

Satisfaction with their school's home-school relations:

•	Teachers	87.2%
•	Students	83.2%
•	Parents	74.1%
